The Cellular Pathology Department

Black Country Pathology services offers semen testing at 3 sites: New Cross Hospital, Russells Hall Hospital and Walsall Manor Hospital. Appointments for all 3 sites are handled by the Cellular Pathology department based at New Cross Hospital.

Introduction

This leaflet will explain what the post vasectomy semen analysis test is for, how to collect your sample and how to get your results.

What is the test for?

After a vasectomy you will still have sperm in your semen. This should clear after 16 weeks or 24 ejaculations following the vasectomy.

You have been referred for this test to confirm that your vasectomy has been successful.

You will be required to produce 2 semen samples. The first sample at week 16 and the second at 20 weeks.

Making an appointment

Your GP or consultant will request that you attend for semen analysis. You will need to book an appointment for this. To do this, please call the cellular pathology department for an appointment and to arrange delivery or collection of a specimen collection kit for semen analysis. 01902 695287.

Please expect a 7-10 day wait for the next available appointment.

Production and collection of your sample

You will need to ensure you have received a request form from GP or Consultant. The requesting doctors details should be on the request form. If your GP has not given you a form, then contact them and collect one ahead of before your appointment. Samples without a request form will not be accepted.

Try not to have any sexual activity, including masturbation, for a minimum of 2 (48hrs) - 7 days before producing your sample.

There should be at least 16 weeks (at least 24 ejaculations) before submitting your first semen sample for examination.

A complete sample is needed for reliable assessment. If any has been spilt, please inform the laboratory staff as a repeat sample may be required.

Please write your name, date of birth, and the time you produced the sample on the pot and the requesting doctors details should also be included on the form.

First wash your hands and genitals with soap and water, ensure complete removal of all soap residue and dry thoroughly.

The sample should be produced by masturbation directly into the pot. Collect the entire sample.

Getting your sample to us

The sample should reach the Andrology department within 45 minutes from collection for reliable assessment. If you bring the sample from home keep it at body temperature, ideally as close to the body as possible.

Deliver the sample and completed request form to the cellular pathology laboratory.

On arrival to the department, you will be asked to confirm what time the sample was produced and whether a complete sample was collected. It is also useful to know the date of vasectomy and how many samples you have previously provided.

Please note if you use another container other them than the one sent to you, or you do not have an appropriate request form, your sample will be rejected.

How do I get my results?

Your results will be sent to the referring GP or Consultant. Please allow 7 - 10 days for the result to reach them, you will then be able to contact them regarding your result. They can then give advice regarding the success of your vasectomy.

During this time, you should take contraceptive precautions until clearance has been given by your surgeon or doctor.

After your second semen test your surgeon or GP will give you your results and advice regarding the success of your vasectomy.


